

Autism is a developmental disorder that is characterized by severe behavioral abnormalities across all

primary areas of functioning. Its onset is often early; it generally makes itself known by the age of two and one-half. In addition to having a pleasing color a paint must protect the surface to which it is applied and be easy to apply in a thin, uniform coat. (P2) All paints consist of two parts.
